We know that these are not easy times for you and your families, which is why we advise you to follow these recommendations issued by the Government of Quebec:

- · For returning citizens: 14 days voluntary isolation is recommended for all persons returning from abroad.
- If possible, stay at home and avoid going out...
- Call 1-877-644-4545 if you have a cough or fever.
- · Wash your hands regularly and avoid sharing personal items such as plates, utensils and glasses.
- Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer if you do not have access to soap and water.
- · Observe the rules of hygiene when coughing or sneezing.
- · If you are ill, avoid contact with people who are more vulnerable, including the elderly and people with illnesses.
- · Avoid direct contact for greetings, such as handshakes, and use alternative practices.
- If you feel anxiety or emotional distress, you can contact the Info-Social 811 service (24/7 psychosocial telephone consultation).
